Mother's Day Ambassador Ride May 8, 2016

On the second Sunday of May, seven BMWRO members, six old timers and new member Randy Z., met at the Cottage Cafe in downtown Rogue River for breakfast. This is a quaint little place with nice outside seating on the main street.

After breakfast we took Foothill Blvd. along the Rogue River into Grants Pass, then headed west on Hwy. 199 to Selma. There we turned south on Deer Creek Road, following the creek for about 10 miles before it starts up the mountain as a curvy, single-lane Forest Service Road. This eventually goes by Holcomb Peak and gets up over 4000 feet with a beautiful view of the Applegate Valley.

About a month ago I tried this road and got stopped by a huge snow bank. On this day the road was clear with a couple of small snow banks in the shadows. On a clear day you can see forever, or at least to Crater Lake and 9500 ft Mt. McLoughlin almost 100 miles away; but today there were lots of clouds so they were no-shows. This area has hundreds of miles of gravel roads which go in all directions, perfect for GS rides. I've been riding this area for 40+ years and have discovered old mines, old cabins, and old logging sites with abandon equipment. Its pretty amazing what people were able to get into these remote areas, some 100 years ago.

After the view-point stop, we continued on down the mountain on Cedar Flat Road into Williams where we all split up and headed for home. Another great ride on our trusty Beemers.




The wines this year will be from Napa Valley, California. The vintner of choice will be Heitz Cellar of Napa Valley. The wine is their premium wine.
