





A Motorcycle Amble to Amboy NW Ambassadors Ride Report – March 2019

On this last weekend before the return of daylight savings time, once again, the stars aligned. The result was an exquisite day of riding. It was touch and go throughout the month, after a relatively warm winter gave way to four straight weeks with snow on the ground. But First Saturday dawned cool but dry — a perfect day for a ride.

I was not alone in my opinion of the day. Fifteen bikes were raring to go, including a couple of new faces. **Steven Polansky** has been recruiting riders while servicing his bike, resulting in two first-timers,





John Stoinoff and his son, **Tyson. CJ Strauss** introduced us to her friend, **Eric Calhoun** on his new KTM Adventure. After saying hello and enjoying a donut, it was time to get to the matter at hand.

This month's ride would be an exploration of Clark County. We have visited several times in the past, but it's a beautiful destination and there are always new roads to keep it interesting. **Diane** and I conducted the train, while Polansky served as caboose. Others in the middle included **Chuck Mileur, Keith Picone, Kyle Emerson, Louie Robida, Camron Rust, Charles Trapp, Jeff Yarnall, David Morganstern,** and **Justin Carr.**

Heading north, we rolled onto I-5, narrowly missing an accident before merging into I-84. As we rolled along I-205 toward Washington, newcomer Tyson Stoinoff decided he must have had better things to do. The rest of us crossed the river, then headed east toward Washougal on WA-14. A left and a right later, and suddenly we were twisting our way through the exurbs. Sunset View Road wiggles its way almost 1,000 feet in elevation before descending to cross the Washougal River on the other side of the hill. Here we found more than enough snow to remind us of the cold we were leaving behind. It had been chilly

enough when we left, that wet roads may have been a hazard; but now it was clear that temps would warm enough to keep us out of harm's way.

Nowhere among our local rides is GPS appreciated more than in Clark County. Unimaginative cartographers have gridded the area with numbered avenues running north/south and streets running east/west. The topography is rugged, so that the grid is constantly changing — streets turning into avenues, turning back into streets. So 242nd Avenue turns into 44th Street which turns into 238th Avenue, whose name changes to 237th Avenue before yielding to 54th Street — you get the idea. There are few memorable names to attach to particularly good stretches; you have to pull up the GPS track to note where the best parts are. This makes it frustrating to lead from memory; you need the GPS to keep you on the right route. On the other hand, it makes unplanned rides serendipitous; you never are quite sure you're where you planned to be.

Today, route management was a non-event; we were on-track, the weather was beautiful and the


roads were a country pleasure. Approaching Hockinson, we were even accompanied by a soaring bald eagle, thermalling above us for several seconds, long enough to be the topic of conversation when we stopped briefly to rest. Soon we were moving again, for the last push to Amboy for lunch.

Eastern Clark County is a region in transition. Logging sustained the area for many years. In 1902, a fire in nearby Yacolt burned 500,000 acres and killed 38 people—1902

was the peak year for timber production in the region. In later years the Army established a munitions base in the area. Camp Bonneville was established in 1909. For the next eighty-five years it served as a drill field and training camp. Now owned by the county, the rugged area remains off limits to the public until munitions and hazardous materials are safely removed. In the meantime, the area copes with the inexorable sprawl from greater Portland.

But it copes well. Small family farms and homesteads dot the heavily wooded roads that we were following today. Property lines mean roads are never straight for long; and as we approached Amboy, the elevation exceeded 1,100 feet as we crested the shoulder of Yacolt Mountain. Four miles later, we were sitting down for lunch.

The **Countree Kitchen and Timbers Saloon** isn't much to look at, but they welcomed us on their reader board and made us feel at home—while serving us monstrous portions of breakfast and lunch. It took awhile to get us all fed; but with all the great roads to discuss, the time passed effortlessly.
