

NW Ambassadors Ride Report-April 2020 David Peterson #90113

Well, to no one's surprise (except, maybe, my own), we held up the white flag and surrendered the April ride to coronavirus. It was the first time since January 2017 that we had to pull the plug. At least that time, our decision was vindicated by several inches of snow on the ground. This time, while the afternoon rain made me glad I wouldn't have to wash the bike again, it left me uneasy about what the future holds.



But it also gave me a chance to remember all the great outings we've had over the years.

I had been thinking the same thing; like many reactions, a catalyst makes it happen. Over burgers one Saturday, we quickly mapped out a game plan. It being winter, we decided the first ride could wait until the weather behaved.

We didn't wait quite long enough. On 2 March 2013, it rained. But that wouldn't stop eighteen new best friends. That first ride was a 178-mile meander over familiar roads to lunch in Clatskanie. All had a really good time. We resolved to try it again in April.

It rained again in April, hard enough to limit us to five riders. But that was it for rain, as the rest of the year's rides were dry. I don't remember why we didn't continue our get-togethers beyond on September that first year (probably weather).

2015 was the first year we filled the calendar. The year started with a cold and foggy ride to spot herons on Sauvie Island. In February, Ric Holderbaum ignored my ride cancellation notice and rode anyway, gaining the distinction of anchoring the smallest outing we've had—one rider, himself! Susan handed over her ambassador reins to Mike Ripley in October and he became my most reliable ally, even after moving to Phoenix in 2018! The year almost ended with a disaster as good friend Colin Luther bagged a deer near Ballston on the December ride from Spirit Mountain casino. Down he went, totaling his bike, not to mention the deer. But he was otherwise all right and back riding with us in February.

It was cold (28⁰!) but sunny and crystal clear when eleven of us kicked off 2016 with a lap around the valley to lunch in Donald. 2016 was also notable for our first ride-and-hike outing to Drift Creek and our first overnight trip to Mt. Rainier. The overnight ride was a huge success. I keep very good records, and I've noticed that although we have about four rainy rides a year, none of them have occurred in August. So August has become our annual overnight ride date.

January 2017 was cold and dark. Reluctantly, I cancelled the ride early in the morning. Good thing, too—by the time I got out of the shower, there were four inches of snow on the ground. I've yet to hear if Holderbaum proceeded without me. We had tremendous turnout throughout the year, even though the weather was mixed or rainy on over half the rides. Thirteen of us enjoyed our overnight ride to Reedsport and its meander through the Smith River watershed.

2018 and 2019 were excellent years, with very good weather and terrific destinations. The highlight to me was last August's two-night sojourn to Enterprise, where 23 of us got to




